BIOGRAPHIES

The Caltech-Occidental Concert Band has appeared in concert at Carnegie Hall and at the Great Wall in China. Later this year, on June 18, the band will perform in Disney Hall. Band members meet once a week to prepare for these concerts. Members of the ensemble are from many facets of the Caltech and Occidental College community. For example, there are members in the group that are undergrads, grad students, alumni, postdoctoral researchers and faculty. There are distinguished scientists from JPL, and a select few members are chosen from the Pasadena Community. Former soloists with the ensemble include Allan Vogel (principal oboist with the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra), Jim Self (tuba player with the Los Angeles Opera Orchestra), Allen Vizzutti (world renowned trumpet soloist), David Shiffrin (clarinet), Loren Marsteller (premiere baritone and trombone soloist with the Marine Band and California Philharmonic), and many others. William Bing began teaching at Caltech in 1970, when he was a graduate student at USC. While his main teaching focus has always been the Caltech Bands, he did find time to play and record with several of the major orchestras in the Los Angeles area, including the Los Angeles Philharmonic and the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra. For ten years, he was a member of the Los Angeles Opera Orchestra, and for five years he performed regularly with the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra. Artists he has performed with include Placido Domingo, John Williams, Henry Mancini, Trisha Yearwood, James Levine, and many others. As a trumpet teacher, his many students have performed with the "Red Hot Chili Peppers," "Green Day," Poncho Sanchez, the "Duke Ellington Orchestra," Dr. Dre, the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the Pacific Symphony, and many other classical, jazz, and rock groups. He has won the ASCIT Teaching Award from the students at Caltech, and been named an honorary member of the Caltech Alumni Association.

Regular guest conductor **Paul Asimow** has a lengthy association with the Band going back to 1991 when he started graduate school at Caltech in geology. Having been student conductor of the Harvard University Band, he was excited to continue conducting at Caltech. Now a Professor of Geology and Geochemistry, Paul has conducted and played in the group for over 18 years on piccolo, flute, Bb tuba and his current favorite, the oddball F tuba. In his spare time he recruits band members to major in geology and geology majors to play in the band.

Pasadena native **Scott Babcock** maintains a busy freelance schedule performing a wide variety of music, from rock and blues to classical. His drum set playing has taken him to three different continents and dozens of countries. In addition to numerous TV and film recordings, he's played drums for artists such as Randy Newman and Karla Bonoff. He has appeared on the Tonight Show with Randy Newman and Lyle Lovett. He performs as a percussionist regularly with the Riverside County Philharmonic, the California Philharmonic, and the Long Beach Symphony. He has been teaching percussion at the California Institute of Technology for more than 25 years.

Matthew Davis lives a dual life. By day, he is a graduate student in chemistry studying how to release drugs in the brain using infrared light. This means he gets to make all kinds of brightly colored molecules, shine light on them, and see what happens! This research is under the expert tutelage of Professor Dennis Dougherty. By night however, Matt plays a whole lot of saxophone. He has had the distinct privilege of studying classical saxophone under Philipp Staudlin, Paul Cohen, and Vee Popat. In 2011 while at Tufts University, he was the winner of the Elizabeth Verveer Tishler competition, rewarding excellence in musical performance. As a soloist, Matt has performed with the Tufts Wind Ensemble and the Saxyderms (a Boston-based saxophone ensemble). Matt has also performed in both the Weill Recital Hall in Carnegie Hall as a winner of the DeGrado Competition and on the main Carnegie stage as the featured soloist with the New Jersey Youth Symphony. At Caltech, Matt performs with the Concert Band (Alto/Soprano), the Jazz Band (Baritone), and with the Extrasoular Jazz Quartet (Tenor). When he's not playing Saxophone or doing chemistry, Matt is playing clarinet with the Caltech Clarinet Choir. He would like to use this opportunity to thank Bill Bing for being an amazing director and a great friend.

Zach Erickson is a first year graduate student of Environmental Science and Engineering at Caltech. He received a double B.A. in music and chemistry in 2012 from St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN, where he studied french horn with Mike Petruconis and Herb Winslow, and conducting under Steven Amundson and Dr. Timothy Mahr. He also enjoys singing and arranging music, and has been an active accompanist for choirs and instrumental/vocal soloists. When not doing music, he enjoys hiking, petting cats, thinking about plant fluorescence, and modeling Southern ocean dynamics.

As a member of the Caltech Music Staff, Lynne Snyder focuses on enriching students' lives through advanced musicianship. She founded and directs the Caltech Clarinet Choir, performs with the Los Angeles Clarinet Choir, TriplepLAy Winds, and several other local groups, and has kept a flourishing private studio for the past twenty years. In addition to studying with the late David Breeden of the San Francisco Symphony and with internationally acclaimed clarinetist/conductor Yehuda Gilad, she has a wide variety of experience from musicals to chamber work, from operas to concert band, and solo appearances in between. An advocate of the arts, Lynne believes music is an essential part of a "well-balanced breakfast." Beyond teaching, performing, and volunteering, she has the good fortune to be the wife of a rocket scientist and mom to three of the world's best children.
