BIOGRAPHIES

The **Caltech-Occidental Concert Band** has appeared in concert at Carnegie Hall and at the Great Wall in China. Next year, on June 14, the band will perform in Disney Hall. Band members meet once a week to prepare for these concerts. Members of the ensemble are from many facets of the Caltech and Occidental College community. For example, there are members in the group that are undergrads, grad students, alumni, postdoctoral researchers and faculty. There are distinguished scientists from JPL, and a select few members are chosen from the Pasadena Community. Former soloists with the ensemble include Allan Vogel (principal oboist with the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra), Jim Self (tuba player with the Los Angeles Opera Orchestra), Allen Vizzutti (world renowned trumpet soloist), David Shiffrin (clarinet), Loren Marsteller (premiere baritone and trombone soloist with the Marine Band and California Philharmonic), and many others. William Bing began teaching at Caltech in 1970, when he was a graduate student at USC. He took a leave from Caltech from 1972-1974, to play in the San Antonio Symphony. After two years in Texas, he realized that playing and teaching in Los Angeles was a better fit for him than a full time orchestra position in San Antonio. On his return to Los Angeles, he was invited back to teach at Caltech, and he's been here ever since, combining a teaching and playing career. While his main teaching focus has always been the Caltech Bands, he did find time to play and record with several of the major orchestras in the Los Angeles area, including the Los Angeles Philharmonic and the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra. For ten years, he was a member of the Los Angeles Opera Orchestra, and for five years he performed regularly with the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra. Artists he has performed with include Placido Domingo, John Williams, Henry Mancini, Trisha Yearwood, James Levine, and many others. As a trumpet teacher, his many students have performed with the "Red Hot Chili Peppers," "Green Day," Poncho Sanchez, the "Duke Ellington Orchestra," Dr. Dre, the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the Pacific Symphony, and many other classical, jazz, and rock groups. He has won the ASCIT Teaching Award from the students at Caltech, and been named an honorary member of the Caltech Alumni Association.

Frank Ticheli's music has been described as being "optimistic and thoughtful" (Los Angeles Times), "lean and muscular" (New York Times), "brilliantly effective" (Miami Herald) and "powerful, deeply felt crafted with impressive flair and an ear for striking instrumental colors" (South Florida Sun-Sentinel). Ticheli (b. 1958) joined the faculty of the University of Southern California's Thornton School of Music in 1991, where he is Professor of Composition. From 1991 to 1998, Ticheli was Composer in Residence of the Pacific Symphony.

Frank Ticheli's orchestral works have received considerable recognition in the U.S. and Europe. Orchestral performances have come from the Philadelphia Orchestra, Atlanta Symphony, Detroit Symphony, Dallas Symphony, American Composers Orchestra, the radio orchestras of Stuttgart, Frankfurt, Saarbruecken, and Austria, and the orchestras of Austin, Bridgeport, Charlotte, Colorado, Haddonfield, Harrisburg, Hong Kong, Jacksonville, Lansing, Long Island, Louisville, Lubbock, Memphis, Nashville, Omaha, Phoenix, Portland, Richmond, San Antonio, San Jose, Wichita Falls, and others.

In addition to composing, he has appeared as guest conductor of his music at Carnegie Hall, at many American universities and music festivals, and in cities throughout the world, including Schladming (Austria), Beijing and Shanghai, London and Manchester, Singapore, Rome, Sydney, and numerous cities in Japan.

Frank Ticheli is the recipient of a 2012 "Arts and Letters Award" from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, his third award from that prestigious organization. His Symphony No. 2 was named winner of the 2006 NBA/William D. Revelli Memorial Band Composition Contest. Other awards include the Walter Beeler Memorial Prize and First Prize awards in the Texas Sesquicentennial Orchestral Composition Contest, and Virginia CBDNA Symposium for New Band Music.

Ticheli was awarded national honorary membership to Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, "bestowed to individuals who have significantly contributed to the cause of music in America," and the A. Austin Harding Award by the American School Band Directors Association, "given to individuals who have made exceptional contributions to the school band movement in America." At USC, he has received the Virginia Ramo Award for excellence in teaching, and the Dean's Award for Professional Achievement.

Frank Ticheli received his doctoral and masters degrees in composition from The University of Michigan. His works are published by Manhattan Beach, Southern, Hinshaw, and Encore Music, and are recorded on the labels of Albany, Chandos, Clarion, Equilibrium, Klavier, Koch International, Mark, Naxos, and Reference.

Michael Birnbryer grew up in the San Gabriel Valley and earned his bachelor's degree in Music Education from Berklee College of Music. Since returning to Los Angeles, Michael has actively developed as an educator and is currently concluding graduate studies at Azusa Pacific University. Michael has been teaching at Blair High School in Pasadena for the past six years and continues to perform as a saxophonist throughout southern California.

Shawn Costantino is Director of Jazz Studies and Instrumental Music at Harvard-Westlake School in Los Angeles where he directs 3 Big Bands, ten small combos, an intermediate jazz rhythm section class, and a wind ensemble. He also teaches classes in improvisation, Jazz history, music technology, song writing, and recording. Additionally, Shawn is an adjunct faculty member at Occidental College where he directs their jazz ensemble. Shawn also directs the San Jose (CA) jazz camp and is on the faculty of The Academy of Creative Education at Oakwood School. Shawn is a Yamaha sponsored Artist & Clinician. As such, he has conducted dozens of clinics, residencies, and performances around the nation. Shawn has played with Phil Woods, Wynton Marsalis, Jim McNeely, John Faddis, and David "Fat Head" Newman, and regularly performs and records with such artists as the Clayton-Hamilton Jazz Orchestra, Marcus Miller, Pete Christlieb, and Snoop Dogg. He is completing work on his Doctorate in Music Performance & Conducting at the University of Northern Colorado. Shawn received his Master's in Music from DePaul University in Chicago and his Bachelor's in Music from the Frost School of Music at the University of Miami.
