PAUL ASIMOW, is a Caltech graduate student in geology. Paul was born in Los Angeles. He did his undergraduate work at Harvard University, where he was director of the school's marching ensemble, the Harvard University Band. He is a real favorite with the both the Caltech Band and the audience. Paul has appeared with the Caltech Band on many occasions; at this point, too numerous to count!

One of his proudest moments was when Bill and his wife Delores, who is in charge of Caltech's Chamber Music Program, received the 16th Annual "Excellence in Teaching Award" from the Associated Students of Caltech.

LES DEUTSCH received his Ph.D. in mathematics from Caltech. He plays the organ and arranges music for many Caltech events, including Caltech's graduation ceremonies. He holds 27 patents in various kinds of digital music systems, and is currently Manager of Technology and Technical Development for Telecommunications and Data Acquisition at JPL. He is married and has two wonderful children.

We are pleased once again to present **ANGIE WHITNEY** as our guest soloist with the jazz bands. Angie is in demand with many bands in Los Angeles, but chooses to contribute most of her vocal talents with the local group, *Art Deco and His Society Orchestra*, which will be performing at the local Pasadena jazz club *The Baked Potato* on June 2 and June 3. Angie is also the featured vocalist on the Caltech Jazz Band's CD, *Exothermic Jazz*. □
